**Franklin Gave All of Us Something to Think About**

I don't know about you but the sermon Sunday was one of the most soul piercing messages I have ever heard. Yes, it was an incredible day of worship and fellowship, but because of Franklin Pierce it was more than that. It was a wake up call, a challenge, to all of us to be aware of our less than total commitment to God, church, and each other. We must see that! There are personal things I know I have to work on and will, and hopefully all of us will do the same.

However, along with other ministries of our church Franklin specifically mentioned the music ministry and how so many keep using excuse after excuse of why they don't "show up" week after week or never get involved to begin with.

The needs in the worship ministry are many: *voices, tech team people, instrumentalists, children for a children's choir.* As most you know we had a children's choir at one time, but again excuses ruled the day on why many could not be a part. Franklin mentioned a few of the excuses that many folks use for not becoming a part of all areas of ministry, but here are some others the staff has heard for years: *too tired, out of town, busy, fishing, camping, dance, softball, band, gymnastics, football, Sunday is a family day or we have company* (have you thought about bringing them). We have replaced our commitment to the Lord with so many other things that seem to **always** come before Him. While those things are good to an extent, they should not be a replacement for church. Think about how many times you have used an excuse. Can we not spare one or two hours for worship out of 168 hours in a week? Are you kidding?

Again, I am certainly not perfect and was convicted by many other parts of the message. The Lord and I will work on those things as we all should strive to be better Christians. But, how can any of us do just that if we don't put God and church first. Let us all seek to find what truly matters in the coming weeks and change what needs to be changed.

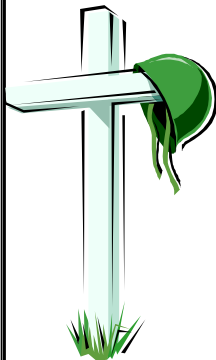

1. **Here If you Need Me:** A true story by Kate Braestrup  
This is the true story of Kate Braestrup's remarkable journey from grief to faith to happiness as she holds her family together in the wake of her husband's death, pursues his dream of becoming a minister, and ultimately finds her calling as a chaplain to search and rescue workers. It is dramatic, funny, deeply moving and simply unforgettable-an uplifting account of finding God through helping others. (listed under nurturing for Community)

2. **Three Cups of Tea:** One man's Mission to promote peace...one school at a time by Geg Mortenson and David Oliver Relin.  
In 1993 mountaineer Greg Mortenson drifted into an impoverished Pakistan village in the Karakoran mountains, moved by the inhabitants kindness, he promised to return and build a school. This book tells the story of that promise and its extra ordinary outcome. Over the next ten years. Greg built not just one school but 55 schools! Especially for girls. His story is at once a reveting adventure and a testament to the power of the humanatarian spirit. ( listed under Education for Mission)
